

Hiring of 13th Officer:

On May 5, 2015, Kevin MacDowell was offered and accepted the position as probationary patrolman. Recruit MacDowell's first day will begin on June 1, 2015. On June 1st Recruit MacDowell will attend the New Castle County police academy for six months.

April 5, 2015 @ 0020 hrs.:

Traffic Stop/Drug Arrests

On April 5, 2015 at 0020 hrs. PFC Giles was checking the parking lot of Greenbrier Village, he noticed one vehicle running with no lights on in a parking spot. D-1 (Skinner) was sitting in the vehicle appeared to be smoking something. PFC Giles made contact with D-1 who was in fact smoking marijuana. A search of the vehicle resulted in one marijuana blunt and a sandwich bag with 1.4g of crack cocaine.

D-1; Jamaine Skinner, 33 Coatesville, PA, was charged with Possession of Marijuana w/Aggravating Factor and Possession of Control/Counterfeit Substance w/ Aggravating Factor (crack cocaine)

D-1 was arraigned by Justice of the Peace Court 11 and released on unsecured bond.

April 5, 2015 @ 1730 hrs.:

Trespassing – Monroe Muffler

On April 5, 2015 at 1730 hrs. PFC Giles was on his way home after his shift when he observed a white male attempting to gain entry of Monroe Muffler in the 600 block of Kirkwood Highway. While waiting for back-up he parked around the corner and approached the suspect on foot who had now gained entry to a tire storage area. The suspect was taken in to custody without incident. No forced entry was made into the building; however this area was fenced in.

D-1; Giorgio Marconi, 55 of the 1600 block of Bonwood Road, Wilmington, was charged with Trespass 3rd and was also wanted on outstanding capiases from various courts.

D-1 was arraigned by Justice of the Peace Court and released on unsecured bond.

April 10, 2015 @ 0930-1400 hrs.:

Suspicious Person

On April 10, 2015 hrs. Sgt. Young, Cpl. Mitchell and PFC Davis were dispatched to the unit block of Vilone Road in reference to a suspicious person. ReCom advised that the subject appeared to be turning door knobs and was wearing a black hooded sweatshirt and gray pants. Officers located the subject matching the description walking in the 600 block of New Road. The subject immediately became uncooperative with officers. During the stop officers located a large rock in his front jacket pocket. The subject was positively identified by the RP.

D-1 is a 16 year-old juvenile who resides in the 200 block of Madison Street, Wilmington. D-1 does have a history of Burglaries and Thefts where his M.O. is trying door knobs. D-1 was charged with Trespassing Third Degree and released to a parent pending a Family Court hearing.

April 11, 2015 @ 0810 hrs.:

CPR – Life Save

On April 11, 2015 at 0810 hours, PFC Davis responded to the unit block of Ruth Road for a CPR in progress. Upon entering the building PFC Davis could hear a female requesting a paramedic. When PFC Davis arrived he found a 24 year-old female laying on the ground, blue, not breathing and no pulse. PFC Davis began CPR and after several minutes was able to regain a pulse. Elsmere Fire Company then arrived and took over CPR. Sara recovered and was transported for further medical treatment.

April 12, 2015 @ 0810 hrs.:

Drug Arrest

On April 12, 2015 at 2130 hrs. Ptlm. Wingate stopped a vehicle being operated by D-1; Leon Rapuano III on Kirkwood Highway for a traffic violation. During the traffic stop the officer recovered a bundle of heroin and \$787.00 in USC.

D-1; Leon Rapuano, 47 of the unit block of Whitekirk Drive, Wilmington, was charged with Possession of a Controlled Substance and a traffic violation.

D-1 was arraigned and released on \$300.00 unsecured bond.

April 12, 2015 @ 0810 hrs.:

Stolen Vehicle Pursuit

On April 15, 2015 at 0116 hrs. PFC Giles and PFC West were handling an issue at the WAWA when they observed two black males enter a stolen vehicle and pull out of the parking lot. The officers attempted to stop the stolen vehicle in the 1100 block of Kirkwood Highway, but the vehicle failed to stop and led officers on a short pursuit. The vehicle did lose control and crashed on the Rte 141 N/B ramp. The three occupants did not have a chance to flee as officers converged on the vehicle. Officers located what appeared to be a handgun, but later was proven to a BB gun.

New Castle County PD arrested and interviewed the rear passenger. The front passenger was released after an interview and arraignment on a separate capias.

The driver was identified as D-1; Richard Robinson, 22 of the 100 block of Elliot Street, Newark. D-1 was arrested for the several traffic violations including; Reckless Driving, Aggressive Driving, Disregarding Police Signal, and Receiving Stolen Property.

D-1 was arraigned by Justice of the Peace Court #11 and released on unsecured bond.

April 22, 2015 @ 2215 hrs.:

Heroin Arrest

As a result of a drug investigation, officers from the Elsmere Police Department were able to arrest Ronald Jochen (45 W/M) of the 3800 block of Frances Avenue, Dunlinden Acres. On April 22, 2015, Jochen was pulled over for traffic violations in the area of Duncan Rd. and Kirkwood Hwy. During the car stop officers were able to see packaged heroin in plain view on the passenger seat. Jochen was taken into custody. A search of the vehicle was completed resulting in the seizure of 529 bags of heroin, 2 alprazolam pills, and 1.5 buspirone hydrochloride pills. The heroin has a street value of approximately \$1,200.00.

Officers were able to secure a search warrant for Jochen's residence and recovered 7.9 grams of marijuana, 20 Hydrochloride pills, and 16.5 Dilaudid pills.

Jochen was charged with the highest Tier level for the Possession of the Heroin and Possession With the Intent to Deliver same. Jochen was also charged with multiple additional drug related charges.

Jochen was arraigned by Justice of the Peace Court and received a \$24,000 secured bond. Jochen was unable to post bail and was transported to Howard Young Correctional Institute.



April 28, 2015 @ 1430 hrs.:

Drug Investigation

As a result of a drug investigation, officers from the Elsmere Police Department were able to arrest two suspected drug dealers, William E. Bacon, 19 year old male from the unit block of N. Clayton Street , and Ronald Maddray, 20 year old from the 700 Block of W. 10th Street.

On April 28, 2015, D-1; William E. Bacon and D-2; Ronald Maddray were pulled over for traffic violations in the area Kirkwood Hwy and Maple Avenue. During a search of the vehicle, officers were able to seize 148 bags of heroin packaged for sale. Back at headquarters, officers located 1 gram of crack cocaine concealed in Maddray's groin area. Officers also seized \$149.00 in suspect drug proceeds.

D-1; Bacon was charged with a Possession with Intent to Deliver and traffic violations.

D-2; Maddray was also charged with a Possession with Intent to Deliver.
